A Word from Fr. Jim: Sunday, April 16, 2023

We have seen fictional disclaimers in the entertainment media: "any connections between the characters portrayed herein and real life individuals is purely coincidental." In my case, I was a day student at a Jesuit prep school in a major city, Scranton, some 40 miles away from my home, Mt. Pocono, a small village of some 580 people in the rural Pocono Mountains of Pennsylvania, As a hitchhiking day-student, I inherited the nickname "farmer" from the city-born-and-bred students who believed that such a small rural residence had to mean my parents were farmers- when in fact there were no farms at all in Mt. Pocono. My dad was a U.S. mail carrier.

A similar misrepresentation is made of "doubting" Thomas in this week's gospel who asked to verify what his fellow followers of Christ had already witnessed for themselves in his absence- namely, the wounds in Jesus' hands and side. This was the same Thomas who not too many days before had urged his fellow disciples to go to Jerusalem to die with Christ, knowing there were people in Jerusalem dead set on making Christ's death a reality. Thomas, in reality, reflected all the logical constraints to blindly accepting the testimony of the others whom he loved and who very easily could have been beset, confused- and even hallucinating- about what they had witnessed.

One of the great contributions of Vatican II was to embrace the findings, past and future, that modern science has to offer about our understanding of God and our place in God's plan of creation. Like Thomas, it ties our beliefs to the other realities of his abundant creation and, unlike Descartes, does not rely on purely subjective beliefs. Insights from such scientific fields as quantum physics even corroborate theological revelations that we are all interconnected as the body of Christ. As Pope Francis has done, we should explore our own beliefs about such things as climate change through scientific evidence as well as theological revelation. Our own doubts can be resolved in that manner.
