A Word from Fr. Jim: Sunday, June 8, 2025

Oftentimes when we talk about the paschal mystery, we define it as the death and resurrection of Jesus. However, it is perhaps more accurate to say that the paschal mystery includes the conception, life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus, as well as the descent of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit unites all things in Christ, including the modern-day efforts of the church on earth.

The church is not simply a building within a local community; it's one, united community of believers in heaven and on earth, bound together by Christ's love. The church enables the mission of Christ, which is the sole reason for her existence. After the pattern of Jesus' own love, we move beyond ourselves, preaching and witnessing to the reign of God. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, our work shares in and continues the work of Jesus.

That work is continued in our ministry to the poor, the lonely and the sick. The mission continually takes us to the peripheries and calls us to engage the human heart through dialogue with the wider culture and society. We must be wary of believers who might say, "the church has no business commenting on my personal life," for our witness is not an individual witness; it's a reflection of the entire body of Christ, whose head is Christ. The good news we preach does not belong to us but to the Lord. When the church focuses too much on her survival, her popularity or even her perfection, she forgets Christ's mission. The good news is not meant to be rationed or hidden, for the Holy Spirit is bestowed on individuals for the sake of the entire people of God.
