### A Word from Fr. Jim: Sunday, November 3, 2024

Let's be honest about it- we don't hear Jesus agreeing with the scribes and Pharisees all that much in our gospels. But, in today's Gospel, we have at least one of their members, a scribe, doing just that and, to boot, Jesus telling him that he is not far from the Kingdom of God. You could argue that love breaks down all barriers, even those that existed between Jesus and his perennial foes. Would that it could be that simple! Pope Francis' most recent encyclical, Dilexit Nos, goes to great lengths to explain the complexities of love and the very seat of love, the human heart- not the mind, the soul or any of the other suspects.

One exegist uses a scene between Tevye and his wife, Golde, in the play, Fiddler on the Roof, to dig into the essence of today's Gospel as they argue about the meaning as well as the importance of love. From another direction, the scribe asks about the first of all commandments and the actions that take priority in response to God's love. Despite talk of commandments, one can not be commanded to feel warmly to another, But one can be mandated to treat another with loving kindness, even an enemy.

Sr. Mary McGlone comes at the issue from the life of a saint, Martin de Porres, whom she cites as a potentially good interpreter of today's gospel Word. When reprimanded by his religious superior for bringing a dirty, sore -ridden and contagious beggar into their cloister and his own bed, he replied that he could easily wash sheets, but not the guilt of ignoring the poor, "compassion, dear brother, is preferable to cleanliness." Today is Martin's feast day and the namesake of a community of "peace and justice" in Trenton, New Jersey, that was part of what inspired my path to the priesthood.




There is a new recycling bin in the hall just for water bottles and cans. Please help us recycle.
